THE ASSIGNMENT

A multi-sector recovery programme needed a credible account of what was working during implementation, where delivery was diverging from design and what could be sustained locally.

WHAT A&K DELIVERED

Evidence matrix; criterion-by-criterion findings; operational recommendations; and a decision-oriented view of continuation, adaptation and scale.

EVIDENCE APPROACH

- Document review, semi-structured interviews, focus groups and direct field observation
- Engagement with programme teams, partners, community relays, associations, frontline staff and beneficiaries
- Assessment through A&K's TAQYIM lens: theory, adaptation, quality, inclusion, learning and multi-level effects
- Eight criteria covering relevance, coherence, effectiveness, efficiency, impact, sustainability, inclusion and learning

DECISION-RELEVANT FINDING

The evaluation examined reported delivery of 357 psychosocial follow-ups against a target of 300, 219 agriculture beneficiaries against 150, and support to seven residential education structures.
